

Presidio Elementary School Policy for Parent Involvement



Education succeeds best when there is a strong partnership and communication between home and schools. CAMPUS PARENT INVOLVEMENT POLICIES AND PRACTICES REQUIREMENTS AND HOW ACHIEVED

- 1. **Requirement:** Involving parents in the planning, review, and improvement of Title I, Part A Programs **How Achieved:** Parents are encouraged to attend meetings and to contribute their ideas to plan, review, and improve the Title I, Part programs. At a PTO during the 1st semester of each school year the parent involvement policy will be evaluated, reviewed and/or revised. After the evaluation, review and/or revision, the parent involvement policy will be published on the school website, posted in each of the school offices and disseminated to parents. Notices of meetings will be posted and/or sent home with students prior to the meeting and in the language of the parent. Interpreters will be provided at all meetings.
- 2. **Requirement:** Providing parents of participating children timely information about Title I, Part A programs
 - **How Achieved:** Parents receive information about the Title I, Part A programs from the handbook, school newsletters, PTO meetings, family academic activities, parent liaisons, teachers and administrators.
- 3. **Requirement:** Providing a description and explanation of the curriculum in use at the school, the forms of academic assessment used to measure student progress, and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet.
 - **How Achieved:** The handbook provides information about the curriculum, academic assessment, and proficiency levels. Parents are encouraged to visit with teachers and/or administrators for further explanation or clarification of any of these important areas. During the school year, no less than 2 parent-teacher meetings are required for each student to discuss student programs and progress.
- 4. **Requirement**: Build the schools' and parents' capacity for strong parental involvement. **How achieved:** Yearly surveys will be conducted to evaluate the effectiveness of the parental involvement program and get feedback on barriers to greater participation by parents in all school settings and activities. The school will continually solicit ideas for improvements and/or additional activities for consideration.
